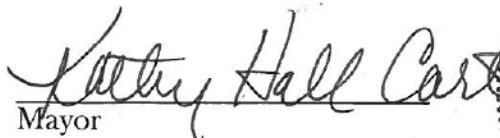

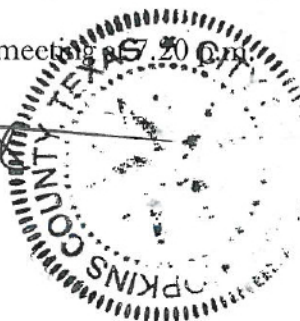

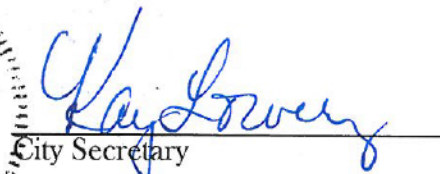
- I. Mayor Kathy Carter called the meeting order at 6:30 p.m.
Invocation And Pledge Of Allegiance
The invocation was given by Ms. Deidre Maples and the pledge was recited by the Mayor, Council and Citizens in attendance.
- II. Announcements – Mayor Carter announced the Back to School Bash went very well. The café is opening under new management and is going to be Shiny Pennies.
- III. No presentations were made by citizens.
- IV. Consent Agenda
Jackie Holley moved to approve the consent agenda. Cody Talley seconded, the motion passed 5-0.
- V. New Business
 - A) Cody Talley moved to order the City of Cumby General Election to Mayor, Alderman Place 1 and Alderman Place 2 for November 6th. Monty Lackey seconded, the motion passed 5-0.
 - B) 1) Cody Talley moved to proceed with the requirements to approve the roll back property tax rate for the City. Jackie Holley seconded, the motion passed 5-0.
2) Cody Talley moved to table the garbage rates until the next meeting. Jackie Holley seconded, the motion passed 5-0
- VI. Reports
 - A) Police Department
Paul Robertson stated there were 271 total citations issued in July with 322 calls for service, 94 warning citations, 5 crashes worked, 2 incident reports, 5 offense reports and 5 arrests.
 - B) Maintenance Department
Johnny Carter submitted a report for May with a 2.29% water loss, June with a 5.86% water loss and July with a 3.97 water loss. Also was reported that a leak on Tarrant Street had been repaired and the TCEQ wastewater inspection was complete with no violations.
 - C) Fire Department
Chief Heath McCraw submitted a report for the month of May with 1 call in the city, 8 in the county, 2 grass fires, 1 car fire, 3 structure fires, 1 medical call, 3 motor vehicle accidents and 10.78 manhours. The month of June was 2 calls in the city, 25 in the county, 7 grass fires, 3 car fires, 1 structure fire, 6 medical calls, 8 motor vehicle accidents, 2 investigation/standbys and 61.90 manhours. The month of July was 5 calls in the city, 22 in the county, 9 grass fires, 1 car fire, 2 structure fire, 4 medical calls, 9 motor vehicle accidents, 4 investigation/standbys and 45.55 manhours. Chief McCraw requested for a roofing contractor to be able to come and look at the coverage for the fire department building.
